#### **Rediscovering America's Godly Heritage**

Morality has always been a key factor in how a country's future unfolds. Values and principles have a major role in the decisions people make and how they behave in a society.

In 1963 the Supreme Court removed prayer from public schools. Noted historian David Barton made a revealing study on the American time period of 1963-1993. He noted an alarming social trend. Consulting Human and Health Services and the Census Bureau's statistics, he noted the following information about the thirty-year period:

Single-parent households increased by 25 percent. Birth rates for unwed teenage girls increased by 300 percent. The cases of teens having gonorrhea increased by 400 percent. The number of violent crimes committed increased by 600 percent.

These statistics are a distu4rbing profile of what happens when God is left out of our society and illustrates the heavy toll it takes on our culture.

#### THE WAR IN AFGHANISTAN

(This is the final set of short comments on Wars fought beginning with the American Revolution through the Iraq War)

The Taliban militia was driven from Kabul in November 2001, but two years later large sections of Afghan territory remained in the grip of local militias. Soldiers gathered in the mountainous Konar and Nurestan provinces of Eastern Afghanistan, engaging in high-altitude offensive action called Operation Mountain Resolve. It was launched in November 2003 to route out fighters loyal to the Taliban, Al Qaeda, and the renegade Afghan militia leader and "global terrorist" Gulbuddin Hekmatyar. But the odds were steep, as the local roads were treacherous and civilian authority was limited. Helicopter was the preferred mode of transportation. Wahhabism, an unusually rigid form of Islam, is the dominant religion. In light of these factors, and its proximity to the Pakistan border, the area was sometimes referred to colloquially by American troops as "Enemy Central."


