Tri-care for Life is unable to make one of our meetings until possibly sometime in the fall. CO is keeping communications with the one representative.

The next meeting of the Gun Club will meet the 29th of June at Range 14 in Fort Dix.

Bob and Pat Constantine were given thanks for finding Maritsa's for the Armed Forces Day Brunch on Saturday, May 18, 2013. We had 30 members attend and a good time was had by all. Our next brunch will be September 14, 2013 at Maritsa's for Patriots' Day.

Bus trip on Saturday, June 22, 2013 to Gettysburg historical Park and Museum is still available at this time. Several members have already signed up.

Our guest speaker for the evening was Sgt. Drew Lincoln who was deployed to Afghanistan three times during his Army career who is now a full-time recruiter for US Army out of Haddonfield, NJ.

Starting in August, 2013 we will be starting to accept nominees for the Saint Barbara and Molly Pitcher awards. All requests should be turned into the Executive Officer, Rich Tomasso by October 2, 2013 meeting.

Corresponding Officer, Marc Kantor spoke on the website of our organization and passed out address labels that he made up for the members of the organization.

Comments made from the floor:

CO mentioned that it is the 69th Anniversary of D-Day on June 6th of this year.

CSM Blum Harris of the 1st114INF announced that their Dining Out will be held at the Camden Aquarium sometime in September. Invitations will be sent out soon.

USAA auto insurance was mentioned for military personnel.

Col Tony Radice mentioned that LTC Tom Hallowell of the 1st114INF out of Woodbury daughter Brooke was in a terrible auto accident and suffered some severe wounds that will require medical treatment for a long time. We are asking that our organization keep Brooke and her family in your prayers at this difficult time.

It was mentioned that the Commissary at Ft. Dix is now closed on Mondays starting July 18th. There is no meeting in July and our next meeting will be Wednesday, August 7th, 2013 at 7:00pm. Meeting was adjourned at 1951 hours.

Retired Senior Leaders Briefing

On Thursday June 6th the Adjutant General, BG Michael Cunniff invited retired senior leaders from the National Guard of New Jersey for an annual briefing. A summary follows:

- 1. There are no anticipated NG unit deployments for next year due to an anticipated change in national policy at this time. Presently there are 67 NJANG soldiers presently deployed and 191 NJARNG soldiers deployed (164 soldiers are due to return this day at McGuire).
- 2. The DMAVA presently conducts a monthly medal award program at various Malls throughout the State to present deserving soldiers and retirees with an appropriate award for their service.
- 3. It was acclaimed that the NJNG performance before, during and after Hurricane Sandy was New Jersey's "finest hour." It not only pre-positioned 2300 soldiers for anticipated

service in providing fuel, food, shelter, security, recue (to include animal rescue), transportation and rebuilding operations, but also was instrumental in developing a national policy regarding duel status command and control during such an emergency.

4. Although there has been a 10% reduction in the 2013 budget, the following construction money has been appropriated as indicated:

Army Aviation Support Facility at Lakehurst: \$49,000.000 (130,000 SF)

Regional Training Facility at Sea Girt: \$34,000.000 (86,000 SF)

BG Doyle Cemetery: \$23,000.000 (130,000 SF)

Disaster Repair: \$32,000.000

5. Other Information: NJ has the lowest military suicide rate in the nation. The Department was conducting Sexual Harassment training for all E-7's and above as the senior briefing was being conducted to help prevent an increasing national trend in the service.
