A NOTE FROM A GOLFER

When I had my first chance to chat with him I asked him about the bag.

His response was simply that it was a gift. I then asked if he was wounded and he said yes. When I asked more about his injury, his response was "I'd rather not talk about it, sir".

Over a few holes I learned that he had spent the last 15 months in an army rehabilitation hospital in San Antonio Texas. His wife moved there to be with him and he was released from the hospital in September. He was a rather quiet fellow; however, he did say that he wanted to get good at golf. We had a nice round and as we became a bit more familiar I asked him about the brand new set of <u>Ping</u> woods and irons he was playing. Some looked like they had never been hit. His response was simple.

He said that this round was the first full round he had played with these clubs.

Later in the round he told me the following: As part of the discharge process from the rehabilitation hospital, <u>Ping</u> comes in and provided three days of golf instruction, followed by club fitting. Upon discharge from the hospital, <u>Ping</u> gave each of the discharged veterans, generally about 40 soldiers, a brand new set of custom fitted clubs along with the impressive golf bag.


